Maddy's mother won't let her daughter go out of home. Her mother is denoted as the empty-nest syndrome which means she experiences loss and sadness. Maddy and her mother's relationship is very manipulative. Maddy can't leave the house because her mom works outside the home, and still, she appears as if she doesn't have a clear understanding of the social life outside. Maddy wants a decent life and wants herself to be socially active but the situation she was brought in is completely different. She doesn't have a stable life as she didn't even celebrate her birthday with anyone. Her Mother is bossing her life here as she doesn't allow any of Maddy's friends to be close to her. Her only friend she got is her nurse Carla.

"After I lose, we go to the couch and watch our favorite movie, Young Frankenstein. Watching it is also part of our birthday ritual. I put my head in her lap, and she strokes my hair, and we laugh at the same jokes in the same way that we've been laughing at them for years. All in all, not a bad way to spend your eighteenth birthday" (Yoon 23).

Madeline is struggling here so as the common audience in their normal life. No one likes to be a servant to the boss. Here the mother is taking authority over her, but at the same time, it is shattering her desires and wishes. She is the authority means she decides what to do, and which one to reject. To her, it is her daughter's life and she is doing what she thinks will be best for her. But actually, it is causing her dreams and desires of her. Maddy and her mother celebrate the birthday quietly as there is no joy over there. Eating and watching movies don't make her happy. She wants something very joyful and very pleasant. "In my white room, against my white walls, on my glistening white bookshelves, book spines provide the only color" (Yoon 13). Her life under white walls means her life is only with her mother, Carla's daughter Rosa has grown less close now and she is old enough to be interested in boys. But in the case of Maddy, she is still reading Flowers for Algernon, a favorite book of hers and she is re-reading it. Carla has grown up her daughter in the right way Maddy's mother is different from her.

The eighteen year girl Maddy has no way to take a boyfriend to her mom. Madeline's mother is not ready to let her daughter speak with outsiders. She fears that her daughter communicates with outsiders without her knowledge. She may run out from her hands Maddy's mother is visibly saddened over having to deny Maddy the chance to socialize with neighbors. Maddy finds her life as the enjoyment of her mother.

"See I think there are roads that lead us to each other. But in my family, there were no roads- just underground tunnels. I think we all got lost in those underground tunnels. No, not lost. We just lived there" (Saenz, 21). These are the lines from Last Night I Sang to the Monster by Benjamin Alire Saenz. Everyone in this world felt some pain in their childhood. It may be intentional or unintentional, but that time have the backup from our family. The pain of illness, accident, or violence and some damages are done emotionally through the unexpected death of family members, accident, and divorce of parents. In Maddy's case, she was affected by her family. In Olly's case, he was affected by her drunkard father. He refuses to allow Kara to paint her nails black. Olly has an interest in athletics but he made him join football. She learned her lessons online. She is not allowed to go to school and she is also not allowed to speak with anyone else other than her mother and Carla. She doesn't even visit her tutors, the only tutor she met twice was Waterman. He is one of the favorites of Maddy and he never treated her as someone different. He also allows Maddy to enter his house. Maddy felt some connection with Olly and slowly a small relationship was building up there. This was quite not acceptable for Maddy's mother. But here Maddy's mother is interfering with them and this makes her think about this relationship again. She asks her mother about the usage of internet facilities and she responded as she wasn't interested to talk on that particular matter.
